
City Council Meeting Recap

Items below were discussed or voted on during the September 17, 2024 City Council Meeting. All items and their full presentations can be found on the Public Meeting website <u>HERE.</u>

6449 Glenridge Dr and 6450 Barfield Rd

Mayor and Council approved a Conditional Use Permit to modify the scope of expansion of an existing Place of Worship campus, including replacing the existing meetinghouse and adding an additional parking lot.





Right of Way Acquisitions

Two right of way acquisitions for Project S2193, Hammond Drive Improvements were approved on the Consent Agenda.

Construction Contract Award for Riverside Drive Stormwater Mitigation Project, Phase II

A construction contract award was approved in the amount of \$686,400 to Vertical Earth, Inc. for stormwater system repairs.



Construction Contract Award for Brandon Mill Road Sidewalk Project

Council approved a contract award to Backbone Infrastructure in the amount of \$1,692,376 to construct a sidewalk on Brandon Mill Road between Brandon Ridge Drive and Lost Forest Drive, TSPLOST Project S-2187. Work is planned to take approximately nine months to complete and will include repaving that portion of Brandon Mill Road in conjunction with the improvements.

Sandy Springs Police Department and MARTA Communication

Mayor and Council approved an Intergovernmental Agreement between the City and MARTA for shared access to 800 MHZ trunking talk groups. Sharing of the radio talk groups will enhance the ability to communicate between departments, increasing protection of citizens, visitors, businesses, and officer safety in the respective jurisdictions.

Memorandum of Understanding with Cumberland Academy of Georgia

Mayor and Council approved a Memorandum of Understanding with Cumberland Academy of Georgia, an organizations that specializes in the needs of children in fourth through twelfth grade with high functioning Autism, Asperger's, ADD, ADHD and other learning differences. The City would allow use of the Hammond Park athletic field and activity building at an equitable rate for the City's use of their gymnasium. The City would also partner with the Academy to provide volunteer and educational opportunities when possible.

PUBLIC SAFETY

We are deeply saddened by the loss of our first Fire Chief, Jack McElfish. On Monday, September 16, Chief McElfish peacefully passed away after a battle with cancer. His legacy will live on through every firefighter he trained, every life he saved, and every person he inspired. Rest in peace, Chief McElfish.

SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS - FIRE DEPARTMENT

Fire units responded to the following reported incidents:

- A motor vehicle/pedestrian accident involving two pedestrians and a single vehicle in the 6300 block of River Shore Parkway. Personnel assisted AMR with patient care.
- A trash or rubbish fire at a two-story single-family dwelling with no visible signs of smoke or fire from the exterior in the 300 block of Fountain Oaks Lane. Personnel were informed that a burning candle had accidentally ignited some clothing. The fire was extinguished prior to their arrival. No extension or hazards were found, and ventilation was performed.
- A trash or rubbish fire in the 1100 block of Hammond Drive. Personnel found a cardboard box on fire in the parking
 garage. The fire was extinguished. The Fire Marshal's Office was contacted to conduct an investigation. There was no
 damage to the structure or hazards found.
- An arcing fire in the 6100 block of Roswell Road. Personnel were informed of a small fire near a wine cooler against the wall. A 120-volt outlet appeared to have overheated or arced. The burning material was extinguished prior to their arrival. The breakers for the appliances were secured, and no extension or additional hazards were found.
- A structure fire in the 60 block of Northwood Drive. Personnel observed light smoke emanating from the roof of a two-story multi-family structure. Upon entering the involved unit, they found light charring in a back bedroom. The ceiling joint was actively burning, along with adjacent beams. Other crews were assigned to search and evacuate all adjacent units. The fire was extinguished, and overhaul was performed. Power to the building was secured, and the Fire Marshal's Office was contacted to conduct an investigation.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS, TSPLOST, AND TRANSPORTATION



What's happening in Sandy Springs

S2163 Northland Drive Sidewalk

Construction is nearing completion for the installation of 300 linear feet of sidewalk on the east side of Northland Drive extending the sidewalk south from Northland Ridge Trail to Landmark Drive. Additional roadway travel lane width was also added as part of this construction effort. A utility pole is currently scheduled to be relocated with final work for the project scheduled to be completed in October.

Current Projects Throughout the City

TS 108 Roswell Road at Dalrymple Road Intersection

Grading, curb and gutter, wall finishing, sidewalk, and signal installation are underway in preparation for roadway paving. Paving is now forecasted for October.





Two-Week Lookahead






TS111 Spalding Drive at Pitts Road Intersection

Residential driveways and curb and gutter are being completed in preparation for roadway paving. Weather permitting, roadway paving work is scheduled for the week of September 23, 2024.

TS191 Mt. Vernon Highway at Johnson Ferry Road

Construction is underway to include grading, curb and gutter, and sidepath on the new connector road. Road base preparation for the planned Stage 2 Traffic Shift is ongoing adjacent to Veterans Park. The shift to Stage 2 is currently forecasted to be implemented in early October. Roadway paving to support the Stage 2 Traffic Shift is currently scheduled for the week of September 30, 2024.

2024 Capital Paving Contract

The City awarded our annual roadway resurfacing project for fiscal year 2024 in January with work beginning in March and final work completed this month. Approximately 21 miles of City streets, 67 street segments in all, were resurfaced this year.

RECREATION AND PARKS

Dog Park Improvements

The City is preparing an excavation project outside the fenced dog area where a 500' ditch has silted over and no longer functions as a water conveyance channel. Runoff from the hillside is no longer captured and directed away from the dog park as it should.

Debris must be removed before the ditch is deepened, widened, and rock lined. A temporary "bridge" over the large gas line travelling under the park has been installed to safely allow heavy equipment to travel through the work area. The dog park will close September 30 and reopen the week of November 18. The nearby fishing pier and boat ramp and adjacent multipurpose trail will remain open.



Springway Trail

The eastern half of the Orkin Lake boardwalk's metal deck pan installation is complete and represents 1,550 linear feet. The metal deck pan will ultimately receive concrete for the permanent surfacing, matching the surface material elsewhere on the trail segment. The contractor is now working from the spillway and proceeding easterly with 500 linear feet of deck pan. Areas where the boardwalk is straight allows the installation to move more rapidly, but installation through turns is a slower process. The boardwalk is closed to the public and will remain closed throughout the duration of construction.


