## City Council Meeting Recap

Items below were discussed or voted on during the October 15, 2024 City Council Work Work Session or Regular Meeting. All items and full presentations can be found on the Public Meeting website <u>HERE</u>.

#### TS131 Peachtree Dunwoody Bike/Pedestrian Trail - Last Mile Connectivity Project

Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. provided a concept plan to enhance bicycle and pedestrian safety and access on the west side of Peachtree Dunwoody Road, spanning from Hammond Drive to Mt. Vernon Highway. The concept plans establish a twelve (12) foot wide bicycle and pedestrian side path with a six (6) foot wide landscape buffer. This initiative includes design, right-of-way acquisition, utility coordination, and construction phases. The trail will increase access and connectivity to local MARTA stations and integrate with the Peachtree Dunwoody Lake Hearn Connectivity Project, Path 400, and the Mt. Vernon Highway Corridor Improvements.

A Public Information Open House (PIOH) was held on August 15, 2024, at the Perimeter Community Improvement District offices with approximately 35 attendees. The online public comment period was available through August 29, 2024. Staff also attended the Dunwoody Springs Homeowner Association meeting on September 25, 2024, to provide an additional information session.



#### **Right of Way Donations**

Four right of way donations were accepted on the Consent Agenda in support of Project S2186, Mt. Paran Road and Powers Ferry Road Sidewalk (Rebel Trail to Carol Lane).

#### T0033-7 CDBG Roswell Road Streetscape Phase 2 - Lake Placid to Northwood

Mayor and Council approved award of the construction contract to undertake this next phase of Community Development Block Grant funded sidewalk improvements. Georgia Power Company plans to commence utility relocations next month in advance of the construction

#### **Development Authority**

Mayor and Council appointed several members to the Development Authority:

- Chip Collins was appointed to serve a fourth four (4) year term commencing October 21, 2024 and ending on October 20, 2028
- Ed Ukaonu was appointed to serve a second four (4) year term commencing November 4, 2024 and ending on November 3, 2028
- Hardy Dorsey was appointed to serve a second four (4) year term commencing November 4, 2024 and ending on November 3, 2028

#### Fulton County Citizen Oversight Council for TSPLOST 2022-2027

Mayor and Council appointed Donald Huffner as the City of Sandy Springs representative on the Fulton County TSPLOST Citizen Oversight Council.

#### SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS - FIRE DEPARTMENT



The City of Sandy Springs hosted a memorial service for its first fire chief, Jack McElfish, on Monday, October 14, 2024 at the Byers Theatre.

Fire units responded to the following reported incidents:

- A gas leak in the 2500 block of Summit Springs Drive. Upon arrival, personnel detected an odor of gas inside the residence. The possible source was determined to be the hot water heater supply line. The gas service was secured at the residence, and no further hazards were identified.
- A fire in the 8000 block of Adair Lane. Upon arrival at a two-story multifamily structure, personnel observed no visible signs of smoke or fire from the exterior. Personnel were informed of a stove fire that had been extinguished prior to arrival. No further hazards were identified.
- A gas leak in the 5000 block of Kingsport Drive. Upon arrival at a two-story condominium, personnel were advised of an odor of gas inside the residence. A gas monitor confirmed elevated gas levels. The gas service was secured at the residence, and ventilation was performed. No further hazards were identified.
- A structure fire in the 1200 block of Wing Street. Upon arrival at a three-story townhome structure, personnel observed no visible signs of smoke or fire from the exterior. Smoke and heavy fire were found on the first floor. The fire was extinguished. Salvage and overhaul operations were performed. The fire marshal's office was contacted for an investigation.

#### SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS - POLICE DEPARTMENT



- The Sandy Springs Police Department provided a safe environment for the One Year Commemoration of the Massacre in Israel.
- The Community Affairs Officer, along with other officers, attended several community engagements throughout the city.
- The VIP and COP units reported 266 total volunteer hours, which included volunteer hours at the One Year Commemoration of the Massacre in Israel and the current Citizens Police Academy. The COP hours composed of 15 patrol shifts patrolling a total of 670 miles. Additionally, the COP units conducted 22 house checks, 126 business checks, issued 15 handicap parking citations, and assisted officers on 14 traffic related incidents.

# What's happening in Sandy Springs

#### S2187 Brandon Mill Road Sidewalk Construction

The Brandon Mill Road Sidewalk Project will complete a much-anticipated sidewalk network connecting the Abernathy Greenway Park to the Lost Corner Preserve. Along with a recently completed sidewalk segment along Dalrymple Road, this will complete a pedestrian loop including Brandon Mill Road, Dalrymple Road, Roswell Road and Abernathy Road. The final utility work to relocate power poles out of the way of this sidewalk project is currently underway and is expected to be completed in November. The sidewalk contractor will begin work shortly thereafter. The work will also include repaving this section of Brandon Mill Road. The project is planned to take approximately nine months.

## Current Projects Throughout the City

#### Sidewalk and Boardwalk Repairs on Long Island Drive

Our Street Maintenance contractor maintains sidewalks, streets, and curb and gutter throughout the City's roadways and rights of way. As well as filling potholes and making other important roadway repairs year-round, they also help ensure our sidewalk system is kept in good repair. This week, our contractor was on Long Island Drive helping to maintain and repair our pedestrian walkway on Long Island Drive near Lake Forrest Drive.


## T2205-01 Roswell Rd/SR 9 at Fulton Government Ctr. Mid-Block Crossing

Pedestrian lighting installation is currently underway with median landscape planting scheduled for the end of October. GDOT indicates installation of crossing signal equipment scheduled for December.

#### TS191 Mt. Vernon Highway at Johnson Ferry

Paving has been completed to shift traffic to Stage 2 roadway construction alignment. Storm system, curb and gutter, sidewalk/sidepath construction can now take place on the road shoulder made available by this traffic shift. Water main relocations originally scheduled for October 14/15 are tentatively planned for November due to City of Atlanta Watershed water system isolation valve challenges.





## **S2123-1 Roberts Drive Sidepath Scoping Study**



# **RECREATION AND PARKS**

## Dog Park Improvements

The City completed the first of two phases of work to address erosion and uncontrolled runoff above the dog park. The first phase of work has been debris and vegetation removal. The next phase will include grading for a drainage channel and storm structure replacement and is planned through the week of November 18 during which the park will be closed. Last spring, the City held multiple meetings requesting input from the community regarding what improvements were desired for the dog park. One of the common complaints was the need to create dry conditions for pet owners, many who expressed complaints their dogs come home "too muddy" after a visit to the dog park. The second phase of work planned to commence next week will address the runoff problem.

## Springway Trail

The concrete trail installation has been completed on the eastern half of the Orkin boardwalk, from the Edgewater clubhouse Monterrey Apartment at Parkway. Boardwalk work from the western end of the lake included deck pan, welded wire mesh, and concrete pour stop installation, leaving 240 linear feet to connect to the eastern terminus. Concrete installation on the western commence once these elements complete.

# SUSTAINABLE GROWTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP

### U R B A N F O R E S T

- The Urban Forestry Program has been focused on the successful completion of the tree work at the Morgan Falls River/Dog Park. This tree removal project was completed three days ahead of schedule.
- Wood debris that was deemed suitable for reuse was diverted from the green waste facility to be used in Sandy Springs. Wood mulch will be used for Fall mulching of several City parks. Hardwood slabs may be used for 'natural benches', and smaller 'tree cookies' will be used for education and environmental programming through the Urban Forestry Program.
- City contractors worked to remove Japanese Stiltgrass by hand at Lost Corner Forest Preserve. Only mechanical controls are used at this park to preserve its natural beauty and to limit unintended consequences of chemical use.
