## SANDY SPRINGS PUBLIC SAFETY

#### HAPPENINGS IN SANDY SPRINGS



Community Affairs personnel attended the North Fulton Rotary Club meeting on January 27, 2025, to discuss CPR and AED training initiatives. Several Rotary Club members have volunteered for the Sandy Springs Fire Department's citywide CPR certification class on March 22, 2025.

#### SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS - FIRE DEPARTMENT

Fire units responded to the following reported incidents:

- A reported motor vehicle accident in the 4600 block of Roswell Road. Upon arrival, personnel found a vehicle
  overturned on its side at the bottom of a steep hill with an occupant trapped inside. Personnel extricated the
  patient, secured them on a backboard, and carried them up the hill to the ambulance stretcher. AMR handled
  patient care.
- A reported motor vehicle accident at GA-400 southbound and MARTA off ramp. Personnel arrived on the scene
  of a two-vehicle collision with two victims trapped inside one of the vehicles. Personnel extricated both
  patients. AMR handled patient care.
- A reported structure fire in the 200 block of Northwood Drive. Upon arrival, personnel observed light smoke coming from the exterior of a building and a small fire in a crawl space. Firefighters found active charring on the flooring and walls inside the structure. The ceiling and paneling were removed from adjacent units but found no fire extension into the attic space. The fire was extinguished, and overhaul operations were performed. A total of four units were affected. The Fire Marshal's Office was contacted to conduct an investigation.
- A reported gas leak in the 5800 block of Brookgreen Road. Upon arrival, personnel were advised of an odor of gas in the kitchen. Personnel found a loose gas line going into the oven. The gas was secured to the oven.
- A reported gas leak in at Ball Mill Place. Upon arrival, personnel were advised of an odor of natural gas inside the residence. Personnel confirmed a slight odor and found the fireplace gas valve slightly opened in the on position. The gas valve was secured, and ventilation were performed.
- A reported gas leak at 100 Barrington Hills Drive. Upon arrival, personnel were advised of an odor of natural gas upon exiting the residence. Personnel found a faulty regulator valve on the gas main at the rear breezeway. The gas line was secured. Atlanta Gas Light was notified.

#### COMMUNITY EVENTS IN THE CITY

- SSPD officers observed and evaluated a lockdown drill at The Mount Vernon School.
- SSPD officers attended two Daddy Daughter Dances at City Springs.
- Officer Greene attended a "Back the Blue" Q&A panel at Holy Innocents' Episcopal School.
- Officer Greene dropped off donated items at Solidarity Sandy Springs.

#### **VOLUNTEER UNIT- POLICE DEPARTMENT**

• The VIP and COP units reported 261 total volunteer hours. The COP hours included 15 patrol shifts patrolling a total of 839 miles. Additionally, the COP units conducted 20 house checks, 165 business checks, issued 12 handicap parking citations, handled 12 private property motor vehicle accidents, and assisted officers on 7 traffic related incidents.

## **T7249 GLENRIDGE DRIVE AT JOHNSON FERRY ROAD/GLENAIRY DRIVE**

The City hosted a Public Information Open House regarding proposed improvements at the intersection of Johnson Ferry Road, Glenridge Drive, and Glenairy Drive on Thursday, February 6, 2025.


The existing intersection is a signal-controlled skewed intersection. The angle of the intersection for right turning vehicles from eastbound Johnson Ferry Road to southbound Glenridge Drive is 150 degrees, and right turning vehicles often roll through the intersection. Several rear-end crashes have occurred related to uncertainty of whether or not the eastbound Johnson Ferry Road right turning vehicle will stop. The current striping for crosswalks does not meet accessible standards. Bicycle lanes are present on the north leg of the intersection but are absent for all other approaches. The intersection experiences approximately 10 crashes annually with 75 percent rear end crashes and 12 percent angle crashes. Project alternatives presented in the Open House:

#### Improved Traffic Signal Alternative

- Realigns the intersection and improves alignment of all approaches
- Improves signal operation (removes split phasing for east and west approaches)
- Decreases vehicle delay at the intersection
- Removes the painted islands and tightens the Johnson Ferry Road right turn radius
- · Right of way impacts are primarily on the NE corner

#### **Roundabout Alternative**

- Single-lane roundabout
- Decreases vehicle delay at the intersection
- Provides traffic calming/speed reduction benefit
- Improves alignment of all approaches
- Expected crash reduction
- Right of way impacts in the NE and SW corners and potential impacts to tree(s) in the Sandy Springs Village Community property on the NW corner

#### **Council Work Session Sidewalk Program Update**

An update to the Capital Sidewalk Program was presented to include the draft ranking of sidewalk candidate segments. You can view the update <u>at this link</u>.

#### Approval of Purchase and Sale Agreement for Right of Way

Council approved the purchase of right of way at 651 Hammond Drive in support of the Hammond Drive Improvements Project S2193.

Acceptance of the Dedication of an Easement for the Construction and Maintenance of Slopes Council accepted the dedication of an easement at 14 Mt. Paran Road in support of the Lake Forrest Sidewalk Phase 1, Project S2185.

#### Approval of a Construction Engineering and Inspection Service Contract to AtkinsRealis

Council approved the award of a Construction Engineering and Inspection contract to AtkinsRealis in support of the Path 400 construction project currently scheduled to take place over the next three years.

#### Approval of the North Springs MARTA LCI Study

Council approved the North Springs MARTA LCI Study, which includes plan for the Peachtree Dunwoody Road Corridor and provides guidance for potential future development on MARTA owned property. Additional information about the plan is available at this link.

Approval of a Contract with the Georgia Environmental Protection Division of the Department of Natural Resources for the FY23 Section 319(h) Nonpoint Source Implementation Grant Council approved the award of a 319(h) Grant for improvements along the Abernathy South Greenway. #### Final Design Plan for Old Riverside Park

Staff provided an update on the final design plans for Old Riverside Park. The plans are nearing completion and will be submitted for permitting to all required agencies and then placed out to bid for construction, once permits are approved.

## Maintenance Projects Throughout the City


- New electric meter added for Crooked Creek Park that will eventually power an automatic gate and pole camera.
- Ridgeview Park underground water leak at water fountain had to be hand excavated and repaired for a broken water pipe. A new shutoff and outside spicket were added. It was tested well for operation and no leaks.

## SPRINGWAY TRAIL

To date, 4,550 linear feet of railing on the Orkin Lake boardwalk is installed. Erosion control materials have been removed in areas where soil stabilization is complete.

#### Work plan for the weeks of February 10 and 17

Continue installation of boardwalk rail and safety wire and place signage in those areas previously inaccessible due to materials storage.

# SUSTAINABLE GROWTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP

- Work began at the Mayor's interchange. City contractors, planted over 50 trees on the site, including
  a combination of sycamores, tulip poplars, red maples, hawthorns, and a capstone ginkgo to
  commemorate the lasting legacy of Mayor Eva Galambos.
- Planting for screening and beautification was completed at the Sandy Springs Fleet Center. 20+ trees
  were planted a combination of thuja green giant and red maples. Prior unsuccessful plantings were
  removed and replaced with a combination of hawthorns and oaks.
- A design for the City's new reading garden at the public library has been created by staff and will be implemented after the Public Works path project is completed.


#### **UPCOMING SHOW**


