2024 VFW FIRST RESPONDERS OF THE YEAR FEBRUARY 11, 2025



Each year, the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 10822 in Sandy Springs and Dunwoody recognize emergency services enforcement persons, law officers, and firefighters for their exemplary service. SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS - FIRE DEPARTMENT

Fire units responded to the following reported incidents:

- A reported motor vehicle fire on Southbound GA-400 by the Northridge bridge. Personnel arrived on scene to find a single vehicle with flames and smoke showing in the on-ramp emergency lane. Personnel extinguished the fire with no exposures.
- A reported single motor vehicle collision in the 1600 block of Spalding Drive. Upon arrival, personnel found one
 vehicle off to the side of the road after striking a telephone pole. No injuries were sustained, and Georgia Power
 was notified about the damaged pole.
- A reported vehicle fire on Eastbound I-285 by the Riverside bridge. Personnel arrived on scene to find a fully
 engulfed vehicle. Personnel extinguished the fire and no injuries were sustained.
- A reported structure fire in the 100 block of Northwood Drive. Upon arrival, personnel found a two-story apartment complex with smoke visible. Personnel located the fire in the attic and successfully extinguished the fire. Crew members also extinguished fire that had spread into the walls. After extinguishing hot spots and overhauling rooms, personnel left the scene.
- A reported cooking fire in the 8900 block of Roberts Drive. Upon arrival, personnel found a two-story row home with light smoke showing, and the homeowner advising the fire was out. The resident extinguished the stove fire by using a dry chem extinguisher. Personnel removed the stove from the residence and checked for extension with none noted. The structure was ventilated by a positive pressure ventilation fan without incident.



Riverview Road - Stormwater Maintenance and Rehabilitiation



Existing public stormwater pipes were discovered to be failing and in poor condition. Drainage structures were replaced and a "spin-cast" method of lining was used to repair a pipe without excavation.






Two Week Lookahead

Mt. Vernon Highway and Johnson Ferry Road Intersection Improvements TS191 and Mt Vernon Highway Corridor Improvements Project TS192

The TS191 project continues curb and gutter, storm drainage, and wall installation plus utility relocations by Georgia Power and Atlanta Gas Light. A major water main tie-in was completed on 2/6/2025. The TS192 project also completed a major water main tie-in on 2/18/2025. A second tie-in scheduled for 2/19/2025 was postponed due to cold temperatures and will be rescheduled for a later date. Major wall construction across from the Mount Vernon Upper School is scheduled to begin the week of 2/24/2025. Both projects are on schedule for completion in the Spring of 2026.


T0033-7 ROSWELL ROAD SIDEWALKS (CDBG) PHASE 2

Phase 2 of the Community Development Block Grant-Funded (CDBG) sidewalk improvements along Roswell Road has begun. This segment of the project will improve pedestrian safety along the western side of Roswell Road, between Northwood and Lake Placid Drive. Initial activities will include utility relocation in February and March, followed by sidewalk construction this Spring and Summer.

City Council Meeting Recap

Items below were discussed or voted on during the February 18, 2025, City Council Regular Meeting. All items and full presentations can be found on the Public Meeting website <u>HERE</u>.

2025 City Council Priorities

Council adopted the following priorities as the 2025 City Council Priorities, originally discussed during the annual retreat held from February 5 to February 6, 2025:

- Set the standard for excellence in CUSTOMER SERVICE and CITIZEN ENGAGEMENT;
- Deliver the highest quality PUBLIC SAFETY services;
- Create and support targeted ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT opportunities with a focus on REDEVELOPMENT;
- Promote SUSTAINABLE GROWTH and foster ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP;
- Provide inclusive and diverse RECREATIONAL & CULTURAL ENRICHMENT;
- Enhance multi-modal TRANSPORTATION ACCESSIBILITY and maintain high COMMUNITY APPEARANCE standards; and
- Ensure long-term WATER RELIABILITY, RATES, and SERVICE for all residents and the business community.

Contract Awarded to Excellere Construction LLC

Council approved the award of a construction contract to Excellere Construction LLC to construct 1,240 linear feet of 6-foot sidewalk on the west side of Lake Forrest Drive from 4838 Lake Forrest Drive to 4852 Lake Forrest Drive and from 5022 Lake Forrest Drive to 14 Mt. Paran Drive.



FY25 Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership Program

Council approved a resolution to apply for the FY25 Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership Program Grant for Springway Trail Segment 2C.

Certification of Estimated Rollback Rate for Tax Year 2025 - House Bill 581

Council authorized the Mayor to execute the certification of estimated rollback rate for tax year 2025, as required, by March 1, 2025. The City of Sandy Springs millage rate is 4.731 mills, which is the same millage rate the City of Sandy Springs Charter permits. The Sandy Springs millage rate combined with the homestead exemption results in a lower tax burden than most of its neighboring municipalities.

2025 Mayor and City Council Retreat Day Two - February 6, 2025

Financial Health of the City

The First Tryon Advisors presented the 2025 financial health update for the City of Sandy Springs to Mayor and Council. This presentation included a market update, credit rating overview, financial overview, and debt overview.

The Power of Responsive Government

The City Manager discussed the City's growth since incorporation in 2005, including major accomplishments, the realized savings resulting from the City's shift from contracted to city-held positions, and a comparison of Sandy Springs to similar cities throughout the United States. After the presentation, Mayor and Council participated in a SWOT analysis.




On February 16th, the City Springs Theatre Company hosted their Encore Gala and benefit show for the City Springs Theatre Conservatory.

On February 15th, comedian Matt Rife performed to a sell out crowd with his quick witted, edgy humor. He returns on February 22nd for his second sold out show.









