Sidewalk Overview

Sidewalks are planned and funded in several different ways

- When a lot is developed or redeveloped when required by code
- As part of a larger project that often includes work on adjacent roadways or intersections
- On their own as a part of the Capital Sidewalk Program

The Capital Sidewalk Program has three sub-categories

1. Priority List for Sidewalk Master Plan Segments

- Scored at the request of the public based on 10 evaluation criteria
- Highest scoring projects are designed and constructed (typically with TSPLOST funds since 2016)


2. Gap Fills for Sidewalk Master Plan Segments

- Small, low-cost gaps between existing segments are given priority and funded with general city funds

3. Neighborhood Program

- Applies to neighborhood areas not on the Sidewalk Master Plan
- Funded differently, with neighborhoods sharing in the cost (25%) of design and construction with the City
- A neighborhood petition with 65% approval from the impacted property owners is required
- Once the neighborhood funding is secured, elected officials decide on City funding
- No projects currently active or funded
