SANDY SPRINGS PUBLIC SAFETY

FIRE DEPARTMENT - SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

Fire units responded to the following reported incidents:

- A water rescue on the Chattahoochee River south of the Johnson Ferry Road boat ramp. Rapid deployment of the Drone allowed crews to locate the two adults approximately 30 yards down river of the boat ramp on river right. Personnel deployed the swift water boat and safely brought the civilians back to the ramp. No report of injuries or request for medical assessments.
- A vehicle overturned with entrapment in the 800 block of Trowbridge Lake Road. Crew found one vehicle on its roof down an embankment approximately 15-20 feet. The driver was safely extricated using a stokes basket, and patient care was turned over to AMR.
- Smoke in a residence in the 500 block of Lorell Terrace. Personnel found smoke visible in the basement, made entry and found fire in the interior wall. Personnel extinguished the fire while checking for extension in the ceiling and remaining wall. No extension was found.
- A structure fire at Cameron Glen Drive. Personnel arrived to find smoke coming from the vent of the attic space. Crew members confirmed a fire in the attic and extinguished the fire, ensured all hot spots were extinguished, and completed salvage and overhaul prior to returning to service.
- A structure fire in the 300 block of Brixham Court. Personnel arrived on scene to a small single-story residence with no signs of smoke or fire. Personnel met with the homeowner and was informed the fire was extinguished. Crew members shut down the power to the house, and used a water can to alleviate any hot spots. While checking for extension by removing the paneling on the outside of the residence where the fire occurred, crew discovered burned wires inside of a metal sheathing and noticed the accumulation of smoke building in the home. An instant water heater in a closet was found with wires burning around it, as well as gas lines going into the unit were glowing red and over one thousand degrees. Assistance from Georgia Power and Atlanta Gas Light was requested. The building was evacuated and gas was shut off from the meter on the side of the house.



July 17, 2026: Intersection of Trowbridge Road and Spalding Drive. SSFD Responded to a single-vehicle crash where a vehicle had gone down an embankment with the driver trapped. Personnel stabilized the vehicle and safely extricated the driver.

POLICE DEPARTMENT - COMMUNITY AFFAIRS

- SSPD SWAT assisted DeKalb County Police with the apprehension of an armed robbery suspect in Sandy Springs.
- SSPD Street Crimes Unit assisted Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) with the apprehension of a suspect wanted on state drug charges and federal offenses.

POLICE DEPARTMENT - VOLUNTEER UNIT

The VIP and COP units reported 654.50 total volunteer hours. The COP hours were composed of 76 patrol shifts patrolling a total of 1737 miles. Additionally, the COP units conducted 59 house checks, 1247 business checks, issued 54 handicap parking citations, handled 10 private property motor vehicle accidents, and assisted officers on 31 traffic related incidents.

6880 RIVERSIDE DRIVE DETENTION POND IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

The purpose of the 6880 Riverside Drive Detention Pond Improvements Project was to correct deficiencies in the stormwater detention pond located at the intersection of Johnson Ferry Road and Riverside Drive. Project components included grading a pond access path and maintenance shelf, removing excess sediment and debris to increase pond capacity, and installation of trash rack and riprap at the outlet control structures. The contractor currently has completed all work except for installation of the second trash rack, which is scheduled to be delivered early August.

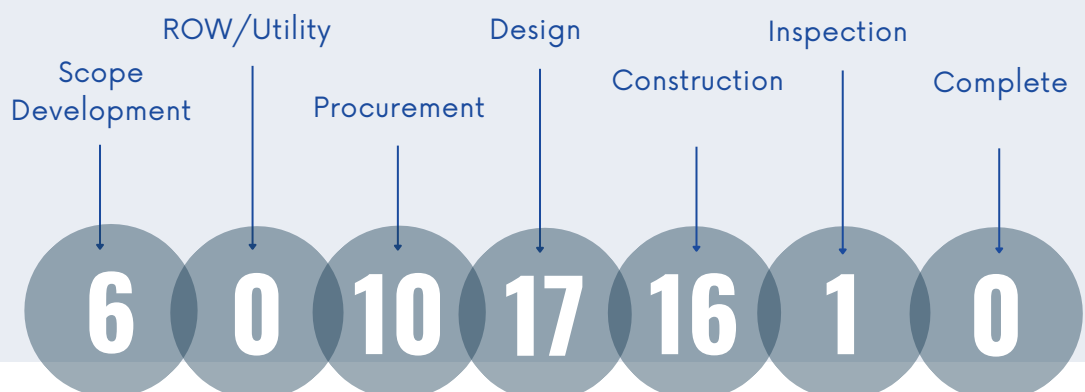

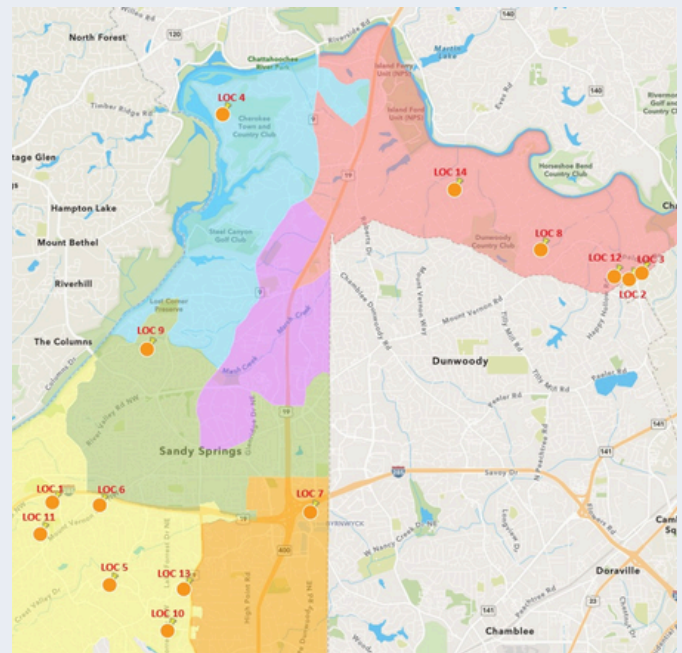
Trenchless Stormwater Pipe Repair Project

In Spring 2026, the Public Works Department initiated a multi-location stormwater infrastructure improvement project aimed at rehabilitating aging drainage pipes using cured-in-place pipe (CIPP) lining technology. This trenchless repair method reinforces existing pipes with minimal surface disruption, extending service life and ensuring compliance with current city standards. The project involves pipe rehabilitation at the following locations:

- 865 Marseilles Drive – 25 linear feet of 18-inch diameter corrugated metal pipe
- 7520 Spalding Lane– 32 linear feet of 24-inch diameter corrugated metal pipe
- 7600 Nesbit Ferry Road – 133 linear feet of 18-inch diameter corrugated metal pipe
- 8680 The Fifth Green – 29 linear feet of 18-inch diameter corrugated metal pipe
- 405 Londonberry Drive – 31 linear feet of 18-inch diameter reinforced concrete pipe
- 485 Mount Vernon Highway NW – 33 linear feet of 18-inch diameter reinforced concrete pipe
- 5785 Peachtree Dunwoody Road – 117 linear feet of 18-inch diameter reinforced concrete pipe
- 3395 Spalding Drive – 10 linear feet of 15-inch diameter reinforced concrete pipe
- 3395 Spalding Drive – 45 linear feet of 24-inch diameter corrugated metal pipe
- 155 North Mill Road – 26 linear feet of 24-inch diameter reinforced concrete pipe
- 4869 Lake Forrest Drive – 26 linear feet of 24-inch diameter reinforced concrete pipe
- 190 North Devereux Court– 18 linear feet of 24-inch diameter corrugated metal pipe
- 190 North Devereux Court – 180 linear feet of 30-inch diameter corrugated metal pipe
- 7580 Wolf Brook Drive – 32 linear feet of 36-inch diameter corrugated metal pipe
- 134 Silverwood Drive – 66 linear feet of 18-inch diameter corrugated metal pipe
- 875 Waddington Ct – 107 linear feet of 18-inch diameter corrugated metal pipe

Associated work requires pipe cleaning and flushing, CCTV inspection and videography, liner installation, testing, and cure tracking as outlined in the approved plans and specifications. Construction activities commenced on May 18, 2026 and are planned to be completed in September.

Public Works Emergency Responses

July 4th Storm

Overnight on July 4th, a severe thunderstorm caused significant damage to trees and overhead utilities, creating power outages and blocking streets across the City. Particularly hard hit was Lake Forrest Drive, where over 21 trees were downed, many of which were entangled in power and telecommunication lines. Significant emergency repair efforts on the part of our utility providers plus our Public Works service contractors helped restore services, operate traffic signals and reopen roadways. Repair work was finally completed on Lake Forrest Drive and road reopened to traffic on July 8th.



Roberts Drive Water Main Break

On the evening of July 13, 2026, a vehicle struck a fire hydrant on Roberts Drive near the intersection with Roswell Road causing it to break off at the 12" main. This lead to significant damage to the road way due to the volume of water that flowed. Atlanta crews responded and were able to repair the hydrant and main, but the road remained closed until it could be fully restored later that week, including repaving of the damaged section.

Weekly mowing work resumed April 1, 2026. Secondary roads remain on a monthly mowing cycle.

Large sidewalk repairs – Sidewalk repairs ongoing – 368 repairs completed since January 2, 2026.

Sidewalk Small Trip Hazard Removal locations are being chosen.

Sidewalk cleaning begins in July.

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City Council Meeting Recap

Items below were discussed or voted on during the July 21, 2026, City Council Meeting. All items and full presentations can be found on the Public Meeting website [HERE](#).

WORK SESSION

- 2026-177 — Update on The Next Chapter: Council received an update on The Next Chapter, the City's Comprehensive Plan and Recreation and Parks Master Plan update.

REGULAR MEETING

- 2026-179: The City Council approved and accepted a deed dedicating 245 square feet of right-of-way from SGCP Lakeside, LLC for property at 5795 Glenridge Drive, which was required in connection with Community Development File LDP-26-33.
- 2026-180: The City Council approved and accepted a deed dedicating 975 square feet of right-of-way from Newbridge Custom Homes, LLC for property at 4750 Rebel Trail, which was required in connection with Community Development File BR-25-396.
- 2026-181: The City Council approved a purchase and sale agreement with The Gandhi Family Trust for 275 square feet of temporary construction easement and 3,327.01 square feet of driveway easement at 4970 Lake Forrest Drive, with an \$8,400 cost-to-cure payment for driveway-column impacts related to the S2185 Lake Forrest Drive Sidewalk Project.
- 2026-184: The City Council approved a task order for call center services and authorized the City Manager to execute the agreement
- 2026-185: The City Council authorized the purchase of twelve 2026 Ford Explorers for the Sandy Springs Police Department to support fleet needs.
- 2026-186: The City Council appointed Mark Rosenthal and Michael Siegel to the Community Council of the North Fulton Comprehensive Transportation Plan.
- 2026-187: The City Council approved a contract award to Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. for professional engineering design consultant services for the Intelligent Transportation System Ring B Fiber Extension Project and authorized the City Manager to execute the contract.
- 2026-188: The City Council approved a contract award to Gresham Smith and Partners, L.P. for professional engineering design services for the Roswell Road Safety Project Scoping Study and authorized the City Manager to execute the contract.
- 2026-189: The City Council approved an agreement with the Fulton Perimeter Community Improvement District for the Glenridge Drive Sidepath Project and authorized the Mayor to execute the agreement.
- 2026-190: The City Council approved the acquisition of fee simple right-of-way and temporary construction easement from RXHST Sandy Springs, LLC for property at 5885 Glenridge Drive in connection with the Glenridge Drive Side Path Project from Hammond Drive to Wellington Trace.
- 2026-191: The City Council approved an intergovernmental agreement with Fulton County and participating municipalities regarding the use and distribution of proceeds from the 2026 Transportation Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax referendum and authorized the Mayor to execute the agreement.
- 2026-192: The City Council approved an ordinance appointing the Fulton County Department of Registration and Elections to serve as election superintendent for the City's November 3, 2026 general municipal election related to the redevelopment powers referendum, and it authorized the related intergovernmental agreement.

RECREATION AND PARKS

PROJECTS IN PROGRESS

Morgan Falls Dog Park Improvements

Construction began on July 6. The park will be closed during the renovations. New fence, shade canopies and sitting areas will be added. Silt fence has been installed and clearing and grading are ongoing. Significant progress has been made by contractors successfully repairing an aging stormwater pipe, a critical component necessary for the overall function and long-term success of the project. Additionally, new ADA-compliant curb ramps have been installed, improving accessibility throughout the park. Construction of the bioswale has also begun. In the coming weeks, contractors will continue installing stormwater devices and grading for hardscapes. Photos to the right.

Sandy Springs Racquet Center Improvement

Work to install canopy lighting and exterior outlets has begun and is expected to be completed within the next four weeks. Installation of a stone column wrap will begin after the electrical work is complete.

Old Riverside Park Improvement

Installation of the initial erosion control measures is complete. Initial site preparation and earthwork activities have begun. Photos below.



PARK DESIGN WORK IN PROGRESS

Phase 2C Trail

The design team continued to develop the construction documents, meet with stakeholders, and are acquiring right of entry from property owners to complete geotechnical work.

Ridgeview Park – Restroom Addition

Permit drawings were submitted for plan review and permitting. City comments have been received, and the design team is addressing the City's comments. Staff is also awaiting comments on the Fulton County sanitary sewer permit.

Morgan Falls Athletic Complex Phase III Improvements

Fulton County is completing its final legal review of the lease amendment and is now pending City approval. Design of the remaining project elements is ongoing.

Abernathy South Greenway

The sanitary sewer easement documents were submitted to Fulton County for approval. Bid documents are being finalized.

Maintenance and Landscaping Projects

- Completed the installation of a solar-powered automatic gate at Lost Corner Cottage to improve site security, enhance operational efficiency, and support the City's sustainability initiatives. The completed project includes controlled vehicle access while eliminating the need for commercial electrical service through the use of a self-sustaining solar power system.
- Completed the installation of three Pan-Tilt-Zoom security cameras at Hammond Park. The cameras have been positioned throughout the park to maximize coverage of key public areas, enhance visitor safety, and support the protection of park facilities and assets.

Past Programming Highlights

Sports Camp, Soccer Camp and Explorer Camp entered their final weeks of camp. Campers enjoyed field trips to Young Chef's Academy, Georgia Aquarium and Museum of Illusions. On Fridays the sports and soccer camps played against each other in friendly games of soccer and kickball. Campers have also enjoyed World Cup watch parties during lunch and dismissal time. Sports Camp, Soccer Camp and Explorer Camp completed camp with the camps coming together on the last day for games, water slide fun and snow cone treats!

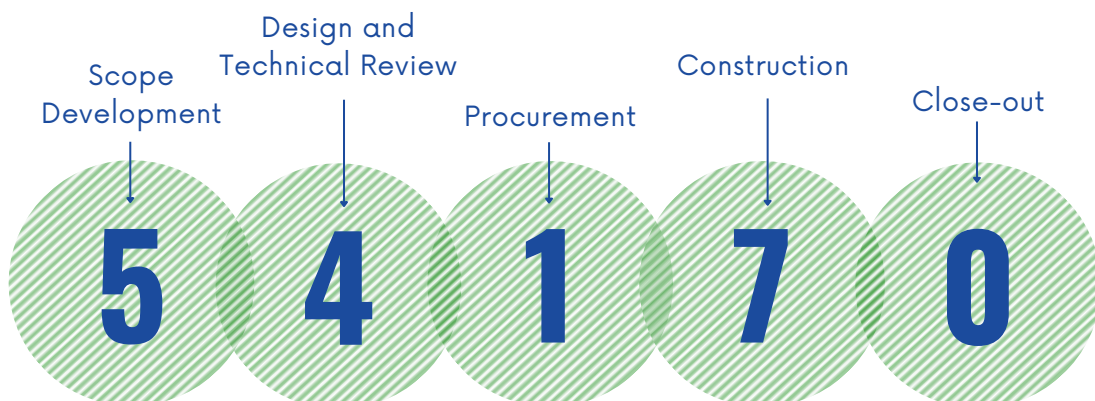
